## *Legacy Building Update, January 2026*

- The temporary walls between the Suter building and the area to be demolished have been built and weatherized.
- The majority of the old Worship Center has been demolished, with only the south wall (main entrance), and the north wall (next to the Suter building), still to be brought down.
- The debris from the demolition should be removed by the end of February.
- We have received a conditional site permit, but a few items are still being requested by the city before the full site permit will be released.
- We have been placed on Oncor's schedule to place the overhead lines on 9<sup>th</sup> street underground.
- All the communication companies with lines located on the north side of Avenue "D" have been contacted and we are waiting for them to schedule the moving or removal of those lines.
- As a reminder, the construction fence has been installed and now all the area inside the fence and temporary walls (area to be demo'd) are considered a construction zone and hard hats are required as well as permission to enter must be obtained from Talley Riggins, our construction company.
- Bricks from the Worship Center are still being placed by the Welcome Wagon at the MAC. We request that you limit yourself to 1 brick per family at this time.

- Pray for 100% of our members to be involved in some way in the Legacy Building project.
- Pray that we will continue to meet our church budget as well as we continue to minister in the name of Jesus.
- Pray for God to continue to be in the entire process and lead us divinely.
