Legacy Building Update, December 2025

- Asbestos has now been removed from the chapel area
- Utilities have been rerouted and on December 4, the Suter Building was shut off to allow the completion of the utilities rerouting and reconnecting. What was originally thought would take 3 days was done in one day. Friday and Saturday were used to make sure everything was back up and running in preparation for Sunday and the CDC's use on Monday.
- The temporary walls have begun to be built to separate the Suter Building from the area to be demolished. Once those walls are complete, a delicate demo will begin to separate the two areas. The delicate demo will provide approximately 2-3 feet of clearance from the ground to the sky between the two buildings, which will then allow the demo of the building to commence.
- The removal of the trees has begun around the property.
- We continue to wait for the communication companies and ONCOR to remove or relocate the overhead lines located on Avenue D and 9th street.
- The construction fence has been installed and now all the area inside the fence and temporary walls (area to be demo'd) are considered a construction zone and hard hats are required as well as permission to enter must be obtained from Talley Riggins.
- Demolition of the building will start in mid-January.
- Continuing to wait to receive the site permit which will then allow the building permit to be released. Demo permit is in hand. Currently waiting on the latest review by the city.
- An agreement with Oncor to move the overhead lines on 9th street to underground has been signed, but we have not received the schedule at this time.
- The three communication companies with lines along the north side of Avenue D, between 9th Street and Glenbrook, have been contacted and arrangements have been made to move those lines.
