






FUTURE PLANS

WHAT IS NEXT?

- FBCG members will pray daily for this building project and seek to know God's will for their financial commitment to the new building.
- Pledge commitments will be made by Sunday, April 21.
- There will be a one-time First Legacy Offering on Sunday, April 28, at which time FBCG members will be encouraged to give a sum amount to kick off the campaign.
- Then, FBCG members will begin their three-year pledge commitments on Sunday, April 28, as well.
- The Beck Group architects will then begin completing the Design and Development phase. This will take approximately 10 months to complete.
- Then, permitting, bidding, demolition, and construction will begin. This will take approximately 20 months to complete.
- During construction, FBCG will worship each Sunday and have Wednesday Bible Study in the Fellowship Hall of the McDonald Activity Center. This time period will be approximately 16 months.
- Our expectation is that FBCG will gather to worship for the first time in the new building at the end of 2026.

Philippians 2:2 APRIL 1: UNITY

"Complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind."

Have you ever thought about what makes a good football team good? Each player on the team is working towards the same goal—to get across the goal line and score. Regardless of their position on the team, scoring and stopping the other team from doing so is the unified purpose for being on that field. The apostle Paul used the word "same" in this scripture to emphasize the need for harmony and the same purpose when working together. CITY OF GARLAND HIGHLIGHTS

After an extensive two-year redesign, Garland recently celebrated the opening of the newly-renovated historic Downtown Square. With its park area and other improvements, the square is an appealing destination for families and others in our community.

The renovation is the culmination of years of planning and work to elevate the experience of visitors. In 2019, the City of Garland passed a \$423-million bond package to go toward numerous city-wide improvements, community amenities, and the downtown renovation.



The redesign extends beyond the Downtown Square. Updates span more than a dozen surrounding blocks and include new building facades, expanded sidewalks, and new street lighting. Also, the Downtown District is at the heart of the Bankhead Cultural Arts District which recently garnered Garland a special designation by the Texas Commission on the Arts.

Garland's downtown revitalization initiative encompasses more than just the square; it involves the transformation of a 57-year-old office building situated at 111 S. Garland Ave. The building, originally constructed for Garland Bank and Trust, and most recently utilized by Chase Bank, boasts midcentury modern-style architecture and holds a place on the National Register of Historic Places. This historic structure, along with adjacent properties, will undergo a makeover to become The Draper, a multifaceted development featuring a blend of retail and office spaces, alongside 155 apartments and 25 townhomes spread across the six-acre site.

CITY OF GARLAND HIGHLIGHTS

"The Draper exemplifies what Garland is about: redeveloping areas in need of new energy while highlighting the history and authenticity of Garland," said Ayako Schuster, director of Garland's Economic Development Department.

The city of Garland is also beginning construction on a new redevelopment project off of I-30 and Broadway. The plans are finally coming into place after decades of work.

The first part of the project will build The Lofts on iThirty, which is a \$64-million project that will include a 340-unit luxury apartment that will be a 12-minute drive from Downtown Dallas and near a DART station and a Walmart.

"This is a great example of what we've been working for, or being able to have developers come in," Garland Mayor Scott LeMay said. "Developers are wanting to work in Garland, they're wanting to bring projects to Garland and what that does is that brings people to Garland and that strengthens the local economy."

14 FREQUENTLY-ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is the cost of the Building Project?

The Beck Group architects estimated in 2023 that the cost of the entire project would be \$26-28 million.

2. What about my regular giving?

Your commitment to *The Legacy Continues* should be an amount that God leads you to give over and above your regular tithe and offerings. We must remain faithful to our regular giving to the operating budget so that day-to-day ministry continues.

3. How will I know how much to give?

Pray daily and allow God to open your heart and direct you to your commitment. Through prayer and the study of God's Word, you will know what to give.

4. How long do I give?

This campaign is a three-year commitment. During the month of April, you will be given an opportunity to complete a commitment card. Members will be encouraged to give a lump sum on First *Legacy* Offering on Sunday, April 28. After this initial offering, the three-year commitment giving will begin.

5. Will my contribution be made public?

Absolutely not. Only the total of all commitments received will be announced.

6. Will I be coerced or pressured to give financially?

Absolutely not. Each member will be expected to give what God leads them to give because they are a part of this body. Not equal gifts, but equal sacrifice will be asked of all members.

7. Do we have to raise the entire \$28 million before we start construction?

No. The final design plans and planning for construction to begin will take some time. During this time, the more money FBCG can raise for the project, the better and less expensive the final cost will be. The goal is to see one-half or more of the total cost of the project given by the time construction begins.



14 FREQUENTLY-ASKED QUESTIONS

8. How should I give?

There are three ways to give.

First, you can give to the building campaign through cash gifts, in person or online, anytime during the project.

Second, on April 21, 2024 FBCG members will be encouraged to make a three-year pledge of giving. This three-year giving period will begin on April 28. You can give much more to God's building when the gifts are spread out over time.

Third, you can give a gift of assets. In addition to monetary gifts, you may give real estate, stocks, bonds, items from your business, coins, gold, designation through your personal will, etc.

9. How will we pay for it?

Through the gifts given by FBCG members over the course of three years. Currently, FBCG has no indebtedness. There are already building fund monies set aside in existing reserve accounts toward this project. Historically, FBCG has never been against borrowing money through the years in order to minister. However, we do not feel that borrowing money is ideal. It is Pastor Greg's daily prayer that God will provide the funding with no long-term debt.

10. When will the capital campaign begin?

Sunday morning, April 28, 2024 with our First Legacy Offering

11. When will the construction begin? How long will it take?

Lead times for construction projects in DFW vary, so it is impossible to say exactly when construction will begin. Architects will first complete the design and development phase in order to produce construction documents for bidding and permitting and our committees will work closely with them. The estimated time for this phase is 10 months. Once construction begins, it is estimated that the project will take approximately 16-18 months to complete. Our hope is to worship in the new Worship Center for the first time at the end of 2026.

12. Where will FBCG worship on Sundays and have Wednesday Evening Bible Studies during construction? In the Fellowship Hall of the McDonald Activity Center

13. What part of the church campus will be affected by the construction?

The oldest portion of our building will be removed. This includes the Worship Center, Hunt Hallway, Welcome Center, Atrium, Chapel, Parlor, Church Offices, The Grove, and Library. All areas in the Suter Building will be unaffected by construction.

14. Where will funerals and weddings be held during construction of the new building? In the Fellowship Hall
